Product overview

IBM Workload Scheduler is the state-of-the-art production workload manager for distributed platforms, designed to help you meet your present and future data processing challenges. It is part of the IBM Workload Automation product family.

1 Step 1: Access the software and documentation



To install IBM Workload Scheduler V 10.2.1, follow the instructions in the Package structure section of the release notes document available at <https://www.ibm.com/support/pages/node/7032127>.

This product offering includes the IBM Workload Scheduler components indicated in the diagram in Step 3. The product documentation can be found online at <https://www.ibm.com/docs/workload-scheduler/10.2.1>.

Some components such as, job types, the Workload Automation Lutist Development Kit, event actions, report templates, playbooks, and much more, are now available for download from Automation Hub at www.yourautomationhub.io. On Automation Hub, you can also find the instructions to deploy them and the related documentation.

2 Step 2: Evaluate the hardware and system configuration



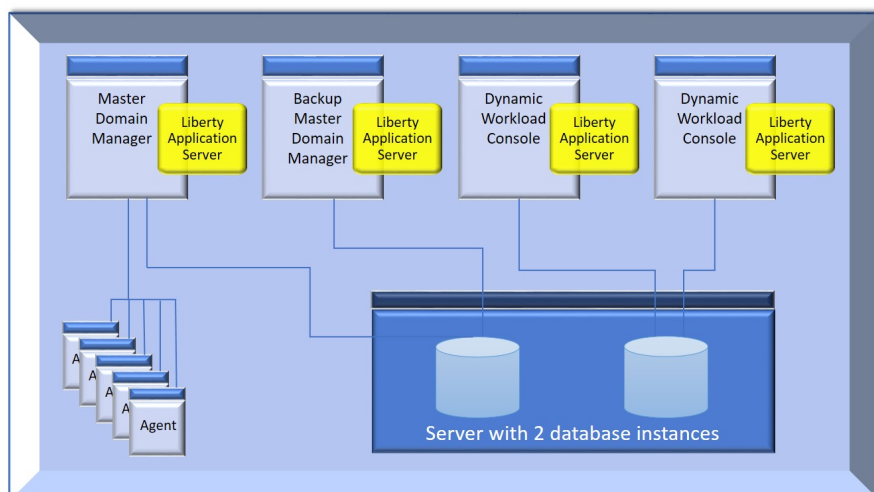

3 Step 3: Review the installation architecture

The full software stack for IBM® Workload Scheduler consists of the following components and workstations:

- One workstation for the database server which hosts both the master domain manager and Dynamic Workload Console databases.
- One workstation for the master domain manager and the related WebSphere® Application Server Liberty Base.
- One workstation for the backup domain manager and the related WebSphere Application Server Liberty Base. The master domain manager and backup domain manager share the same database. This ensures the backup domain manager has the latest data and can take over seamlessly, in case the master domain manager fails.
- Two workstations for two Dynamic Workload Console installations, each of them with their related WebSphere Application Server Liberty Base. The two Dynamic Workload Console instances share the same database.
- A number of agents.

4 Step 4: Planning your installation

You choose to either install the product components using a standard script-based command-line installation that is a very simple and supports all components (master domain manager, backup domain manager, dynamic domain manager, backup dynamic domain manager, Dynamic Workload Console, and agents), or you can also deploy the product using Docker containers that uses a set of pre-installed images for the master domain manager, the Dynamic Workload Console, and the DB2 database. In addition to installing the product components, you can manage the RDBMS requirements of your system using a supported version of either DB2®, Oracle, Microsoft SQL server, OneDB or Informix.

5 Step 5: Installing and configuring



Install and configure the master domain manager and its backup, following the instructions in the *IBM Workload Scheduler: Planning and Installation*. A backup is a master domain manager that you can switch to if there are problems with your current master domain manager.

When you have the product components installed and configured, you are ready to start defining and scheduling your workload from the Dynamic Workload Console. Log in by connecting to:

```

You can access the Dynamic Workload Console from any computer in your environment using a web browser through either the secure HTTPS or HTTP protocol.
